

Three Financing Options

- Power-Purchase Agreement:
 No financial investment on your organization's part. The solar array is owned by an investment group. You just sign the PPA and save at least 10% on the power produced.
- Direct Purchase: Most financially advantageous, but requires more resources and responsibility on your organization's part.
- 3. Congregant Investment: A twist on the direct purchase model. Your members fund the panels and earn interest on the investment.
